

# Student Dress Code

## Dress Code:

At Charleville State High School, it is a requirement for all students to wear their full school uniform on all school days. We believe that wearing a uniform fosters a sense of pride, belonging, and consistency within our school community.

This policy has been developed in accordance with the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006 (Sections 360-363) and the Department of Education policy Student Dress Code SMS-PR-022 in relation to implementing student dress codes in Queensland State schools. The policy clearly outlines the school's response to non-compliance regarding the Student Dress Code at Charleville State High School. The Dress Code is endorsed by the P & C Association.

## Uniform Expectations:

In accordance with this uniform policy, students are to wear the full school uniform when attending school, whilst travelling to and from school or when engaging in out of school activities. Consistent with this policy students are required to always present themselves in a neat and tidy manner when attending school. By adhering to the Uniform Policy our students continue to promote a positive image of the school to our local community and demonstrate that the school has high expectations of its students.















## What happens when a student is out of uniform?

- Prior to the commencement of the school day any student out of uniform is required to report to the office to collect a uniform pass. If the student has a note from the parent/caregiver, the office may excuse a temporary inability to comply with the Uniform Policy.
- The school will maintain a small bank of uniform items for students who present without the full uniform, so the student can change into the uniform supplied by the school for the day and return in the afternoon to collect their items of clothing.
- Families experiencing financial hardship should make an appointment to meet with the principal to discuss options.
- If a teacher considers that a student is inappropriately dressed, including wearing restricted items, the student may be sent to the office to resolve the issue with a member of administration.

## Approved Non-Standard Uniform Items / Special Consideration

For students requiring special consideration in relation to the uniform policy, amendments are available upon consultation with the Deputy Principal of Junior School (Year 7 – 9 students) or Deputy Principal of Senior School (Year 10 – 12). Justifying evidence must be provided.

<p><b>Junior School Uniform:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Charleville State High school unisex polo shirt.</li> <li>• Black Shorts / plain black pants</li> <li>• Closed in shoes</li> <li>• Socks</li> <li>• *CSHS Representative sport uniforms can be worn with the school uniform, excluding formal events.</li> </ul> <p>*Shorts must be of at least mid-thigh length. Bike pants, short shorts / cut offs are not endorsed uniform items.</p>	 
<p><b>Senior School Uniform:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Charleville State High school unisex polo shirt.</li> <li>• Black Shorts / plain black pants</li> <li>• Closed in shoes</li> <li>• Socks</li> <li>• *CSHS Representative sport uniforms can be worn with the school uniform, excluding formal events.</li> </ul> <p>*Shorts must be of at least mid-thigh length. Bike pants, short shorts / cut offs are not endorsed uniform items.</p>	 
<p><b>Formal School Uniform:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Formal CSHS shirt and tie</li> <li>• Black knee length skirt or black pants</li> <li>• White socks, black tights/stockings</li> <li>• Black shoes / boots</li> <li>• Black belt may be worn</li> <li>• CSHS Blazers available for formal events</li> <li>• *Formal uniform is to be worn for formal events, special occasions and can be worn for CSHS Parades.</li> </ul>	   
<p><b>Footwear:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Enclosed shoes, ie; leather shoes, joggers, trainers</li> </ul> <p>Due to Workplace Health and Safety regulations, footwear must provide adequate protection and cover the entire foot.</p> <p>*Steel capped shoes/boots are only permitted to be worn within the ITD workshop and in the industrial kitchen. Not for general wear throughout school grounds.</p>	 
<p><b>Hats:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• School bucket hat</li> <li>• Wide brimmed hat</li> <li>• Wide brimmed hat is required for outdoor classes (Ag &amp; HPE)</li> <li>• Hats are not to be worn inside of buildings</li> <li>• Hats with inappropriate content ie language, offensive slogans are not endorsed uniform items</li> </ul>	 
<p><b>Winter Uniform:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Black jumper/jacket</li> <li>• Long black pants/trackpants</li> <li>• The CSHS Seniors Jersey is able to be worn as part of our winter uniform.</li> <li>• *CSHS Representative sport uniforms can be worn with the school uniform, excluding formal events.</li> </ul>	 

# Student Dress Code

## Jewellery:

- Students are permitted to wear studs or sleepers
- A watch is permitted, NB: if wearing a smart watch, notifications must be disabled during the school day
- Students are permitted to wear a single strand chain necklace that is contained within their school polo. Large ornaments (larger than a 20 cent piece) are not permitted
- Students are not permitted to wear anklets or bracelets.
- Jewellery items may be required to be removed for specific curriculum activities in accordance with workplace health and safety regulations.

## Hair & Make Up:

- Hair must be neat, clean and presentable
- Hair below shoulder length may be required to be tied up for specific curriculum activities in accordance with workplace health and safety regulations.
- Makeup is to be kept to a minimum, natural coloured tinted sunscreens are considered appropriate.

## Non-uniform Days

- Students are expected to wear sun safe clothing during non-uniform days. This excludes thin straps, midriff/cropped tops, singlets and short shorts.
- Clothing that carries offensive or suggestive designs is not to be worn
- Enclosed footwear is required at all times on school site (no crocs, thongs etc)
- *\*Footwear exception may be granted for activities such as the swimming carnival*
